He's a walking miracle!

Realising it was not safe he soon crossed the road to where it seemed safer, however the driver decided to attack him with the car and he left the road to hit him on the footpath, leaving him unconscious.

An ambulance arrived sometime later and Gerald found himself recovering from head injuries and broken ribs. It didn't make national news. The driver was eventually caught and charged. This photo was taken after the event and we can thank God for raising him up to continue in the Lord's service as a Volunteer Chaplain with his wife Jacqueline.

It amazes me the resilience of our Aboriginal Christian people. Right across the country people suffer all kinds of trauma, experiencing waves of grief, loss, death - even by suicide and murder; and yet these Christian people are called on to hold their families and communities together with all of this weighing heavy on the heart.

How do these saints hold up under the heavy loads they experience? There are many suffering with drugs, alcohol, and violence in or around their family. Who do they call on? There are not enough Pastors or Christian leaders to go around and the leaders themselves are hit with these same problems.

How do you keep your head above water, keep your joy and your testimony? 4 Things are important to do -

1 - TALK TO GOD ABOUT IT... ALL of it... "Whatever you ask in my Name I will do it', Jesus said John 14:13 also - Matthew 21:22, Mark 11:24, John 15:7.

2- PHONE A FRIEND – Like on the TV game show. You might not get answers but you will have eased the burden a little. You will have a chance to offload and to pray. A wise friend might help you see things differently. Proverbs 18:24, Colossians 3:12-14, Ecclesiastes 4:9-10, 1 Corinthians 15:33 Proverbs 10:11a.

3 – BRING THE NEED TO OTHERS FOR PRAYER – This needs wisdom. Don't open up every detail to the church and NEVER put it on facebook! Get with faithful praying people who care and wait for the Lord to answer. Matthew 18:19-20.

4- LIFT UP YOUR EYES – There is still beauty and joy and life in this world. God has still blessed you. You are still needed by your family, friends and community so keep your joy. Let your light shine. Luke 21:28

Also – Look up to His coming! It is nearer now than ever. It will be worth it all when we get there! (Romans 8:18) In the words of Ps. Ronnie and Ps. Denzil – "You might be the only Bible some people read". - *Tony Riches*

4th-10th Jan 2020



Small teams have gone through the Kimberley where stats are the worst. Francine and Tony Riches are delivering the SPEAKING 4 WAYS program and are looking to raise support to expand the program and save more lives. We are losing loved ones as they lose hope. There are husband and wife Chaplain teams across the country ministering in the community through visits to hospitals, taking funerals, supporting people through grief and loss and bringing the light and love of Christ into the dark realities of life.

Relationship breakdowns in the local Aboriginal families continues to be a concern. Our hearts go out to the lovely little children who are affected by this trauma. Despite the stress that the children are under most of the local Aboriginal children are still doing very well at school, despite their unstable home life.

It is amazing that they can rise above these distractions! We have another funeral this week. Statistics tell us that the average lifespan of an Aboriginal person in NSW is 60. The man who died was in his late 60's. Liz, the young woman who commenced training in the Air Force earlier this year, is now continuing her studies in Adelaide. Our grandson, Jaylin, who is 20 years old has also been successfully recruited into the Air Force.

Despite the heavy snow close by it wasn't that cold through the day, but some nights got down to minus 4! There were almost 50 women in attendance and a number were there for the very first time. There were 6 or 7 school girls at the convention, the older ladies enjoyed their company as well, and made a fuss of them. FEATURE ARTICLE

Belonging to Christ is a great privilege. As members of the Body of Christ here on earth, we are His people, and together we have a new identity. In 1 Peter 2:4-11, Peter illustrates six aspects of our collective identity in Christ.

"BUT YOU ARE A CHOSEN PEOPLE, A ROYAL PRIESTHOOD, A HOLY NATION, GOD'S SPECIAL POSSESSION, THAT YOU MAY DECLARE THE PRAISES OF HIM WHO CALLED YOU OUT OF DARKNESS INTO HIS WONDERFUL LIGHT" (1 PETER 2:9).

The Lord shapes us so that we fit into our unique and perfect place within the body of Christ.

FIRST, WE ARE LIVING STONES (V. 5) Like physical stones, each of us has our own unique set of qualities. Through these unique spiritual gifts and purposes, the Lord shapes us so that we fit into the perfect place within the body of Christ—a place that no one else can fill.

SECOND, WE ARE MEMBERS OF A CHOSEN RACE (V. 9). We, the elect of God from every nation and every generation, are now God's chosen race regardless of our ancestry. We are those who have been adopted by grace.

THIRD, WE ARE A ROYAL PRIESTHOOD (V. 9). As children of the King, we are commissioned to be His messengers to the world. As we

offer a sacrifice of praise, worship, and adoration to God, we intercede on behalf of others.

FOURTH, WE ARE A HOLY NATION, MADE UP OF PEOPLE FROM EVERY TRIBE AND TONGUE ON THE FACE OF THE EARTH (V. 9).

As citizens of this heavenly nation, we are to be holy as God is holy.

FIFTH, WE ARE GOD'S OWN TREASURED POSSESSION (V. 9).

Consider your own most treasured possessions and how much love, time, and care you pour into them. Now, allow yourself to wonder at the fact that this is how God feels about us.

FINALLY, WE ARE WANDERERS AND TRAVELLERS IN THIS

WORLD (V. 11). For those of us who love Jesus, a great home awaits us once our earthly tour is complete: eternity with our gracious heavenly Father.

Before we come to Christ, we are dead in our sins. We have a false or broken spiritual identity. But now we are “a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God’s special possession, that [we] may declare the praises of Him who called [us] out of darkness into his wonderful light” (1 Peter 2:9). Hallelujah! We are the people of God. Therefore, let us love Him with all our hearts, worship Him with all our strength, and serve Him with all that we are.

Prayer: Lord, thank You for the body of believers who together represent Your Kingdom on earth. Thank You for these friends in the faith. Unify us in Your Truth, that we may shine Your light to a world in darkness. I pray in the name of Jesus. Amen.
